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Camp Information, Rules and Conduct

NOTICE: Please read this page while filling out the application, read it again while getting ready for camp and have the camp participant bring this page to camp. Disobedience of rules and code of conduct could result in a camper being sent home. Upon notification by the Natural Resource Camp director, the Parent/Guardian agrees that they will make arrangements to promptly to pick up the dismissed camper at camp and will do so at their own expense.

Please complete all signatures.

Dates and Location: The 2018 Natural Resource Camp is June 25-30, 2018. Central Idaho 4-H Camp, approximately 17 miles north of Ketchum on Highway 75. Turn left at the camp entrance, which is near mile marker #146 — look for the "4-H Camp" sign and mailbox on the side of the road. Take the gravel road 1.2 miles to the camp parking lot.

Arrival: Youth should arrive at the camp parking lot between 12:30 and 1 p.m. MDT on Monday, June 25, 2018. Please DO NOT arrive prior to 12:30 p.m., as the Natural Resource Camp staff is preparing for registration and will not be able to provide supervision. Natural Resource Camp staff and cabin leaders will be in the camp's parking lot to meet and great campers, provide cabin assignments and direct registration procedures.

Transportation: Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of the parent(s) or guardians(s) of the camper(s). The first camp program requiring attendance begins at 1:30 p.m. MDT. Please check with the Idaho Department of Transportation at http://511.idaho.gov/ for any reported road delays.

Departure/Pick-Up: Families are encouraged to be present for the awards ceremony and slideshow on Saturday, June 30, 2018 at 9 a.m. MDT. Please be at camp by 10:30 a.m. MDT to pick-up your camper(s). Natural Resource Camp staff will be departing at that time.

Restrictions: The Natural Resource Camp is for youth 12-14 years of age. Campers MUST BE 12, 13 or 14 years of age on the first day of camp.

Cabin assignments: Cabin assignments are made by Natural Resource Camp staff and will not be changed. Campers will have plenty of opportunities to associate with other campers not assigned to their cabin.

Phone: There is NO CELL SERVICE at camp. Cell phones brought by campers will be held by Natural Resource Camp staff until the end of camp. The Central Idaho 4-H Camp has a private landline for use by the camp staff only. Campers may use this phone in the case of an emergency, but will need a calling card to make their long distance call.

<u>In the case of an emergency</u>, you may call the camp landline at 208-726-4519. Ask for Randy Brooks, Natural Resource Camp director. Messages may be left on the answering machine.

What to Bring: The Central Idaho 4-H Camp is at 7,000 feet elevation. The cabins are <u>not heated</u> and nights usually go below freezing. Afternoon activities can be in hot or cold conditions. Please make sure that all items brought to camp are free of offensive logos, illegal substances or inappropriate messages.

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Warm sleeping bag and a pillow
Knit hat, gloves, scarf and several pairs of warm socks
Several changes of clothing for hot and cold temperatures — layering works well
Personal articles
Shower shoes
Two pairs of sturdy shoes (broken-in for blister prevention)
Flashlight
Swimsuit and towel for swimming at Easley's Hot Springs
Insect repellent and sunscreen
Canteen or water bottle
Daypack

A blanket, alarm clock, fishing pole and Idaho fishing license, camera, charged batteries, film/memory cards, acoustical musical instruments and journal or address book may also be brought to camp.

DO NOT bring:

Cell phones
Electronics, stereos, iPods and/or radios
Firearms
Fireworks
Knives
Alcohol
Illegal substances
Non-prescription medications

Please leave all valuables at home.

Camp Rules of Conduct and Responsibilities: Following these rules will ensure that everyone will have a safe and enjoyable camp experience.

- 1. Natural Resource Camp directors reserve the right to search items brought to camp by any individual (campers, teachers, cabin leaders and staff).
- 2. Items from the "DO NOT bring" list, if brought to camp, or any item deemed unnecessary by Natural Resource Camp staff will be confiscated, and if appropriate, returned to the camper upon departure.
- 3. Campers and cabin leaders will stay within the camp boundaries, except for scheduled off-site camp activities.
- 4. DO NOT build fires in any area, at any time.
- 5. Campers are responsible for keeping their cabin clean.
- 6. Campers are responsible for lost or stolen items.
- 7. Campers and cabin leaders need to be in their cabins at 10 p.m., with lights out and quiet by 10:30 p.m. MDT.
- 8. Campers will participate in all scheduled activities and are expected to be on time.

- 9. All campers are to stay with their class or activity until dismissed. Rudeness, disrespect and interruptions during camp will not be tolerated.
- 10. Keep showers short and use a minimum of hot water. Please clean up after yourself in the shower house. Campers misusing shower facilities will be responsible for cleanup.
- 11. Stay in defined walkways on camp premises. Treat wildlife, plants and facilities with respect. No carving on trees, throwing rocks, harassing wildlife or defacing the facilities. If you BREAK IT OR DEFACE IT, YOU pay for it or REPLACE IT.
- 12. Crosscut saws and other tools may be used only with permission and adult supervision during the "Tournament of the Outdoors."
